Fiskebäck Missionskyrka is taking steps to be a church without walls.

It can be rather boring to sit in a waiting room. How many of us love waiting at the doctor's office? Not many. That is how we have felt during these past months as we have been going through the process of being sent by Fiskebäck's Mission Church, the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC) and the Swedish Mission Church (SMK). It is not fun waiting but we feel as if it is necessary so we can "GO" with a blessing.

Marcus Svensson and Aaron Thompson went to Donsö Mission Church's Sunday night service on May 15<sup>th</sup> to talk about church planting. While there they took the chance to encourage Donsö's Mission Church to do the same thing that Fiskebäck's Mission Church is doing: start a new church! Every church should start a new church, a movement of new churches is needed if an awaking is going to happen in Sweden. Marcus is a medical student and gave a good analogy that night: cells in the human body need to decide to either grow or to die—there is no other option. At the same time each cell has a specific job to do and all are needed if the body is to function properly. Likewise, the Body of Christ is made up of different cells (churches) and each church needs to decide to grow or to die, because if we don't grow we will die. It's the cold hard truth. And each member of the church is needed in order for the Body of Christ to work.

So, is your church growing or is it dying? What is your part in growing the church? If you don't have a part...perhaps you are helping it to die...this is the truth that people like Marcus and others in the church planting team are experiencing. On the way home from Donsö, Aaron was given the chance to encourage 7 others to also do church planting in one form or another. After these conversations Sara Möller pointed out: perhaps a church planting movement is on its way in Gothenburg. Just think if every church in Gothenburg would start a new church...it wouldn't take much for an awakening would it?!
