Are you sent? And if so, then to whom?



Luke 24:46-49

¹¹ And he (Jesus) said (to his disciples), "Yes, it was written long ago that the Messiah would suffer and die and rise from the dead on the third day. ⁴⁷ It was also written that this message would be proclaimed in the authority of his name to all the nations, beginning in Jerusalem: 'There is forgiveness of sins for all who repent.' ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of all these things. ⁴⁹ "And now I will send the Holy Spirit, just as my Father promised. But stay here in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with power from heaven."

Jesus sums up the Gospel and says it is preached to all nations. Then He gives a direct invitation, "You are witnesses of all these things." What if no one had followed Jesus' invitation, then we might not known Jesus today. Imagine what would happen if we don't follow Jesus' challenge, maybe because of that there is someone who will not get to know Jesus tomorrow...



The word missional is

fairly new to the Swedish language, but the idea is not particularly new. The Latin word *missio* means *send* and the English word *mission* means a charge/command/task. There is always someone who gives the tasks and someone who acts and receives the tasks. God has always been the one who sends and His people have been those who acted and received so that they would then become "sent".

A missional congregation is a church that finds both its identity and mission in God's sending. Like Abraham, we have received a blessing so that we can pass it on. Mission is not just an activity the Church does, but is also a mindset that permeates everything we do as a church and as individuals. Of course, worship and spiritual direction are important; but even in these areas we have the idea of being at the disposal of God and His mission, whether it's about doing outreach on the streets or taking time to talk with a brother or sister in the congregation.

We normally think that mission is about to going to Congo or Ecuador. But a country where about 3% of the population is active in a congregation must surely count as a mission field, right? Yes, this is Sweden I'm talking about! We are called "Brunnen – Church through community" not only because we think it's neat, but because we believe that fellowship with God and communion with others is essential in discipleship. As a Christian you need a community to grow both in faith and as a follower of Jesus Christ. And those who do not believe can find a relationship with God through a Christian community. But only if the community is open and looking outward to those who are outside the church today.

Perhaps it is too easy for us just to sit back and think that others will take care of "missions", just because we are busy doing other things in church. But that's where mission can get shortcircuited. <u>Missional-thinking is instead all about connecting</u> <u>everything we do with our duties as followers of Jesus</u>. Jesus did not stop being who He was when He walked to the market in Jerusalem or when He had dinner with friends. So in the same way we shouldn't stop being His disciples and witnesses when we are in our everyday lives. Or should we stop? I hope not!!!

We are all sent by Jesus to be His witnesses. We can figure out our sent-ness through prayer and discernment, and we can do this together as Christians. But do we dare to be sent out?
