# Santiago Partnership 2025

This has been a big year for the Santiago Partnership! As the year comes to a close, Joel and I reflect on these past years and the ways we have seen God be more than able to give immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine as scripture tells us in Ephesians 3:20. Dreams we have dreamed and even dreams we didn't know to dream; we have been witness to see happen! We are so grateful and so humbled when we look back to see what God has done. In July, as a family we were able to travel to Ecuador and spend time with the team as a whole on the ground. It was amazing to see new faces and known faces and to feel HOME! The kids spent time with friends and so did we! Additionally, in November we had one of our dreams came true as we helped coordinate a "reverse mission trip" for 6 of our Ecuadorian partners to come and teach from an Ecuadorian perspective how to do community development in different contexts.
