In her first post-marathon tournament she and her partner Keiko (who is from Gunma) qualified to represent Gunma Prefecture in an upcoming four prefecture tournament. It will be held in Koriyama city, Fukushima prefecture. This will be the first time Hydi has traveled to Tohoku (North Eastern Japan) for tennis, and we don't think it is coincidental at all that this is where Jim has gone so many times for post-tsunami relief ministries. In the fall Kendra is planning to be in Bangalore, India participating in an exchange program between Pt. Loma and Christ University.
