Well, we made it! We arrived safely in Quito, Ecuador on June 27th. Safe to say it has been an eventful couple of months since arriving. We started Spanish classes the very next morning on June 28th and have continued to have class Monday through Friday from 8:30 to 12:30 with having 1 to 2 hours of homework each night. You can see a picture of our first Spanish teacher, Olgita, below and her brother, Ricardo, who takes care of Simeon during our classes. We say first teacher because Olgita had to go back to her full time job of teaching high school Spanish, so we now have a new teacher Alexandra from a local language school.

Our first two months have been filled with many ups and downs but mainly ups. We appreciate all your prayers for those struggles: Simeon's adjustments to

life in the city at 10,000 feet, computer problems, and troubles with getting our papers setup. We give God all the praise for bringing us many new friends here in Ecuador that have showed us so much love and practical help. Our high-



lights have been a trip to the Amazon (see waterfall picture above) and Mindo, exploring "Old Quito", and making lots of new friends, especially our new relationship with our partner organization IPEE (see below under **Relationships**).
