Between Here and There... Transitioning Back to the U.S.

For some of you, this may seem a little unexpected. It is a bit of a change of plans for us because we were originally planning on returning back to the States in November. Things have been bumped up a little and we have purchased our return tickets for October 9th!

The reason for the change is that we have interviews the week we return as well as a 3-Day Ministry Assessment the following week. All of this is taking place in Chicago as part of the process of us applying to transition from Short-term Missionary status to Long-term Missionary Candidate status. Joel is pursuing ordination for the Annual Meeting in 2013 as well.

We decided to purchase our tickets for this time. It made more sense logistically and financially instead of returning to the States for these interviews just to go back to Ecuador and return

to the States two weeks later when we were originally planning on returning in November. We just couldn't justify these extra expenses in our minds.

Although we will be returning to the States, this does not mean that our ministry or financial needs stop. We already have plans to visit three churches and attend the East Coast Conference Annual Pastor's retreat. These will take place the end of October and beginning of November.

As you can imagine, we will not have a lot of time to adjust from Ecuadorian life that we have known for the last two and a third years to life back in the States.

Simeon was only three and a half months old when we moved to Ecuador so he doesn't really know anything different. Can you believe it has been two years and four months already? How time flies...

WHAT ARE YOU DOING IN THE STATES FOR A YEAR?

This is a great question to ask. Our primary goal while back is to be on home assignment. This means we will be raising support to be Long-term Missionary Candidates with the Evangelical Covenant Church. We will be setting up church visits as well as trying to

meet with individuals in churches and mission boards to tell them about our future ministry in Ecuador. Also, we will be working to create and develop a support base of prayer and financial support in addition to what we already rely on, since the costs of ministry and living

will go up and we will be returning for a longer period. Additionally, Kim will start working as a Family Nurse Practitioner to help gain experience and to learn current practice techniques in this field for when we return to Ecuador.

Many things have developed in contributing to the growth of this dream over our last two years in Ecuador. However, in mid-September, we literally had dreams coming true when we had a Vision Team from the States come to visit. As you probably remember, IPEE (the Covenant Church of Ecuador) made a decision about the location for the center and medical clinic to be a ministry of two districts of churches and specifically in the area of Otavalo.

The Vision Team that came was made up of people that are interested in supporting ministries here in Ecuador by serving on the Board of Directors

Hopefully, now that we have had their visit we can begin to work with IPEE and FACE (the social outreach branch of IPEE) to see what the next steps are in the process. Please pray for the Board of Directors and the future of this ministry.
