## GLOBAL STUDENT LEADERSHIP Vision

Provide an opportunity for US/Canadian youth to develop their leadership skills in an international cross-cultural setting, in partnership with international youth developing their leadership skills at the same time. North American students will live, learn and serve alongside youth from other nations. Teaching and mentoring will be by both North American and international youth leaders. All learning will be done bilingually, in Spanish and English. North American students will live with their international counterparts, attend creative sessions on leadership together, and work together to encourage and enhance local community ministry in the international setting.

Santiago, Dominican Republic – March 23-31 City of 1 million on the north side of the DR

La Villa de San Antonio, Honduras – June 8-16 Village of 5000 about 1 1/2 hours north of Tegucigalpa, and near Comayagua

SLRC, Mexico – July 6-14 City of 200,000 across the US border from Yuma, AZ
